THOUGHT FOR THE MONTH



Everything has changed, life is simply not normal, Easter was not normal. For many people change is really difficult and for others change is a great thing. I'm one of those who likes change, I rather enjoy adapting to a new situation so it's often difficult for me to understand why others find it so difficult. I don't always get it right when faced with a new situation, but I enjoy the challenge.

I collect antique books and often I find something in the book that someone long ago wanted to save, something which spoke to them. Since the books I collect are prayer books it's often prayers or something spiritual which I find.

My latest (£5) acquisition was a prayer book from 1855, nothing really special about it, but in it I found this newspaper clipping. It looks to date from the 1950's and it seemed to me to be an appropriate prayer for the situation we now find ourselves in.



It reminds us that it is simple things which we miss when we are faced with hardship, but that in our hardship there is much to be found as well. There is the good will of neighbours, like when our kettle broke and we couldn't get out to buy a new one. Pat responded to my plea on Facebook and gave us one she had spare.

She's not the only one in the village "...with a heart to feel for all...", nearly everyone is doing something for someone else. COVID-19 is dreadful but through the experience we have been given "...a chance to be... our goodly best for others..." and I pray that after this is finished we continue "...to live as brothers" and sisters together.

I pray that in this time of difficulty you will find blessing "with daily bread and butter", "with health" and "a bit o' song" with each other (by zoom, the telephone or two metres distance anyway).

And just one more thing... there may be no church bells on Thursday evening or Sunday morning, the church building may be closed but the church community is still open. Every Wednesday and Sunday there is a reflection or a service to follow on line. Rough sleepers in Worcester & Maggs Day Centre

Many of us will be distressed to have seen the increasing numbers of rough sleepers in doorways in Worcester and be aware that nationwide, an average of two rough sleepers die each night on the streets of Britain.



There are between 40 and 60 rough sleepers in Worcester city and a further 90 to 100 in the county. About 90% are men, they will often be from broken homes, have failed at school, have mental health problems, drug addiction, and have no means of accessing doctors, dentists, and have no savings or bank account.

Maggs has programmes to help both those living on the street, and those who have come into sheltered housing. The help we can give as a community with very little effort, is donations of items that would be suitable and answers the daily needs of rough sleepers, to include items such as:

Toiletries – toothpaste & toothbrushes,

Soap and face flannels, Shaving cream & disposable razors,

Deodorants, combs, washing powder,

Sleeping bags;

Ruck sacks - a rough sleeper carries his/her world on their backs;

Jogging bottoms, and trousers, and underwear mainly for men (small sizes only – 30" to 32" waist. Rough sleepers don't carry any spare weight!);

St Peter's Church is supporting Maggs by co-ordinating donations of items such as those listed above. During the Coronavirus they need our continued help more than ever. If you have any items you can donate please drop them at the vicarage and we will organise for them to delivered to the Centre during this difficult time. Thank you for your support.

INKBERROW PARISH COUNCIL

The latest meeting was held on Wednesday 15th April 2020, via web cam.

Cncllr. Anthony Hopkins reported that Highway matters, including pavements, because of the limitations of Cov-19 procedures, were currently related to urgent matters of safety only. The clearing of the pavement along the main road would be given priority once the Highways Department was back working at full capacity. Unfortunately the Lengthsman also is unable to carry out his normal duties at the present time. In regard to the Neighbourhood Plan, although some Group meetings had to be cancelled, the good news was that 3 new members had joined the Group making it possible for a sub group to be formed taking on the requirements of the Young, Elderly and their housing needs.

The Deed of Easement between the Football Club and the Parish Council in respect of the "overflow" carpark, was currently being prepared by the Council's Solicitors.

It was agreed that replacement batteries should be purchased for the defibrillator outside the Shop. There was no Police report but it was noted that a number of shed break ins had been experienced in the Dormston area.

It was with regret to note that some bus services had been removed. Cncllr Anthony Hopkins and Cncllr Robin Lunn agreed to look further into the need for this action. Members were grateful that, at least for the timebeing, the refuse collections were on schedule. Both the County and District Councils were facing very challenging times. However, the Parish Council is up and running and making every effort to keep the residents of Inkberrow in touch with news and support via the Inkberrow website. Grateful thanks was expressed to Cncllr Jane Neal for her continued work in keeping the site up to date. Grateful thanks was also expressed to the Village Shop who continued to serve way beyond the call of duty during this difficult time.
