During the lockdown, the Millennium Green has proved a welcome haven for exercise and for getting out into the natural world for many people in the village. The Trustees of the Green have not been able to hold the twice monthly working parties, but many of our volunteers have given their time individually as part of their exercise routine to make sure that the Green is useable and safe for everyone. Our paths have been cut regularly and amenity areas maintained.

Unfortunately, there have been a number of acts of damage over the spring period – especially to the Green’s fences. The Trustees and volunteers work hard to repair acts of vandalism as soon as they are discovered.

The hawthorn blossom has been magnificent this year. As we come to June and July, the Trustees hope that everyone in the village is able to enjoy a beautiful summer at the Green.



The sheep have now been removed from the second field, and the “No Dogs” signs taken down. Anyone is now free to walk dogs in any part of the Green – but please take a poo bag with you.

Finally, thanks to those who have been using the new litter bin at the entrance – it helps to keep the site looking good for everyone.

At last we are nearing a time where the thought of reopening is a possibility! Although the date of July 4th has been mooted, it is not a confirmed date and may yet still change. We are however planning ways we can open and create a safe environment for all. Our precautions will include PPE (such as masks, visors, disposable gowns and gloves, and sanitizers) as well as social distancing, no blow-drying and the cleaning of stations and equipment between clients.

Unfortunately, due to distancing rules we will no longer be able to have more than two stylists in at any time and each stylist

will only be able to have one client at a time. This will impact our productivity and, together with the cleaning time, will reduce the number of clients we are able to see each day. It may also mean that we struggle to answer phone calls - please bear with us and we will do our best to return your calls at the first opportunity! Colour clients will also need to have a skin test before their colour appointment at a pre-booked slot: Sorry, there is no way round this!

Alison has a whole other set of hurdles to overcome due to the close proximity of her treatments. Again, PPE will be used and we have had a clear partition made to allow safe nail appointments.

We will be marking out safe distance spaces and will use a one way system outside - entering up the slope and exiting down the steps where possible. Alison's treatment room will be directly accessible from outside to save entering the hair salon. It will be by appointment only and there will be no waiting area inside the salon - we will come and find you in your car at the allotted time. Patience with appointment times maybe be needed to begin with as we are heading into unknown territory!

We are all very ready to come back to work and cannot wait to see as many of you as we can. We will do our very best to accommodate as many people as possible but please bear with us as we adjust to our new way of working. Hopefully it will be for a relatively short period of time! This is not the way we thought we'd be celebrating our 10th birthday in July but we would like you to know how grateful we are for your continued support.

THOUGHT FOR THE MONTH

*A reflection from Inkberrow resident Nigel Seyler
Will our society (will the church) ever be the same?*

An exchange of emails led to this reply. "I hope things will change soon. But I do wonder if Church will ever be the same again". And perhaps it should not, as we try to take account of the Corona Virus epidemic and of Lockdown, and all this has entailed for everyone.

Yet underlying all this, is our faith, that God in Christ never fails to bring good things out every situation of pain and loss. There will be those who have lost family members or close friends, and with churches closed, people have been unable to mark their loss as they would have wished.

And as this time goes on, many are speaking of a sense of emptiness, a loss of identity, of purpose, a fearfulness about what the future may hold. There are concerns about the collapse of the economy in this and other countries, and the effect it will have on us all, with increased unemployment, the possibility of tax increases, to pay for the governments support, so vital in so many situations. There may be demands for political change – people being unwilling to go along with tax evasion by the wealthiest, "non doms" living here tax free.

But as we look at our Online and Zoom church services during this time, there is much for us to give thanks for and to learn. These have enabled many to take part who in some cases have not been part of our church services in the past. How do we encourage them to come to services in church when we do re-open, to enjoy the music, the singing, to come to know one another, to share in our joys and pains, and in the many social projects that are supported – the Food Bank – Maggs Day Centre for rough sleepers.

God with the help of many people will have been involved in the situations we have all been living through in this time, in care homes, by hospital bedsides, in our daily lives. And just as people and their needs are many and varied, many will be helped to faith if we can but recognise the diversity of our experiences, our backgrounds, *and* the challenges individuals face.

An article by Jonathan *Romain*, Rabbi *and eminent scholar*, said much that is helpful and changing about the new world we are all

moving into. Some of what he said:

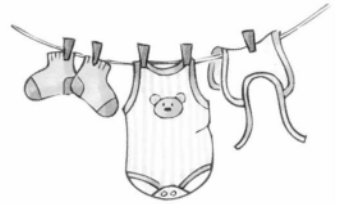
“Even in the conversation between God and humanity, can the message remain the same if the listener is different” then this “ the current crisis has likewise demanded that faith groups either collapse into passivity or respond in creative ways - we have been yanked back into the essence of faith: what counts is not the rule book, but what helps people”.

As we try to work out our response to the world we are moving into, with all its uncertainties, in all this, we are called to be *God’s helpers* knowing that our Lord is with us, and is working to bring good out of these very strange times.

Inkberrow Parish Council

The latest Parish Council meeting was held on 20th May 2020 via web cam.

Under the current Cov-19 situation it was agreed that the Annual Meeting of the Parish Council would be deferred until October 2020 and that Councillor Robin Lunn would remain in the post of Chairman until then. Deferment of Parish Council Annual Meetings followed Government guidelines. All Members were present for the virtual meeting, plus 2 members of the public.

It was reported that all Allotment plots were now let and that there were 3 names on the waiting list.

Problems were being experienced with walkers crossing land with no official footpaths. **Inkberrow does not have a free to wander policy** and only land with official footpath markings can legally be entered. To all those who wish to use the official footpaths please note there is an excellent map, marking all the footpaths in the area, situated in the map case on The Green. Highways had started to mow the grass verges around the County and Recycling Centres had been re-opened, except the Hanbury Road one, due to highway safety issues. However we are asked to only use these Centres if absolutely necessary at the present time.

With the extra number of pupils starting to use the School, parking issues were expected to escalate. It was hoped that children living in the village would enjoy walking to school with cars only used when walking was not practical. Both the Highways Authority and the Parish Council continue to seek answers to this ongoing problem.

Two planning applications were recommended for approval: 20/00753 Mearse Croft, Mearse Lane, Temporary 3 year permission for agricultural worker's dwelling and 20/00914 Le Hollier, Stockwood Lane, Alterations and extensions to cottage.

The footpath from The Tuer to Ross Crescent was to be repaired by the County and the improvements would enable the path to be safely used by pushchairs, wheelchairs etc.

THE PARISH COUNCIL IS STILL WITHOUT A PRESS OFFICER – this voluntary post would suite anyone interested in Inkberrow and reports are only required 10 times a year for Whats On. Please contact the Clerk.

The next Parish Council meeting is scheduled for 17th June, 2020. Information as to what form it will take, together with the Agenda, will be placed on the website.
